Frequently Asked Questions

How do I know if my school is already registered?

If you are a student, check with your Art, English or Language Arts Teacher to see if your school is registered. If you are submitting your entry individually, there is no need for your school to be registered.

If you are a teacher/educator, you can contact Nicolette Omelczuk at 732-833-3783, send an email to njteenmedia@gmail.com, or you can just re-register your school at www.njteenmedia.org. We will sort out any duplicate registrations.

How many students from each school can participate?

There is no limit to the number of students who can participate from each school. Only one entry per individual student is permitted. Whether entries are submitted individually by a student, or as a group through a school, an Official Entry Form, signed by a parent or guardian, must be submitted with each student's entry. What size/length should the entry be?

Original hand-drawn paintings, drawings or illustrations must be submitted on paper, poster board or canvas that is at least 11" x 17", but not larger than 18" by 24". Artwork may be done in ink, charcoal, marker, watercolor, oil or acrylic paint.

Written word entries are not limited by length, but for the purposes of calendar use and/or media display, the New Jersey Department of Human Services, Division of Family Development reserves the right to abridge the entry.
